October 2025

Fungus/Pest/Fertilizer:

- Herbicide applied to landscape beds
- Weeds hand pulled in landscape beds and plant material
- Pre emergent application applied in landscape beds.

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Maintenance:

- As needed mowing service throughout phase 2
- Roses cut back in median on shearwater parkway
- Warranty sod installed at jea station on Windley (999)
- Sod installed at outpost and mailbox kiosk 237 Windley dr.
- Playground mulch installed, tot lot and the rivercliff playgrounds
- Sod installed at "play gator" kayak club.
- Trimming of hedges SW parkway.
- Clearing of signage around phase 2. will will continue to do this as we see obstructions.
- Bi weekly mowing of all ph2 ponds.

Upcoming month:

- continued trimming of privacy hedges in PH2
- weed control in the landscape beds

- Raising of oak trees, throughout community.
- Side trimming and clearing of walking trails.

Irrigation:

- All irrigation has proper run times and coverage
- Run times have been changed to daytime hours for utilizing pressure 3 days a week
- Community garden valve was located and repaired to allow for automated watering of community garden.
- We received a jea high usage alert for the 363 windley dr. we have confirmed the meter is not currently running (leaking) and are going to be investigating to cause. The zone is currently turned off till we find the problem.
- Soil samples from luke drive and shearwater parkway show the ph is close to what it should be, only off by a few points. Two of the macro nutrients required for proper health of the turf are very low, while the third macro nutrient is almost right where we want it. We are working quickly to get these nutrients where they need to be for proper turf health and color.

Below is the landscape maintenance report for Trout Creek CDD Ph 1.

Weekly Maintenance

Maintenance crew is focused on completing our weekly maintenance program within ph1. Our detail personal has been busy preforming weekly weed control within plant beds, removing fallen limbs from tree canopies, removing vine that exposes through plant materials.

Fall annual flowers were installed at the amenity to provide fall color for upcoming events.

Irrigation

From a mechanical stand point the ph1 irrigation system is fully operational. Our team has repaired all vales that were not operating properly and uncovered all valve boxes (most were buried up to 12" in dirt/leaf debris). Currently we have all turf zones operating on battery timers, and will be holding on repairing the 2wire until the entry construction is complete. There are far to may zones that are affected by the construction area to bring the 2wire path online. Bringing the path online will only cause more issues each time the 2wire is compromised by construction.

Agronomics

Fert/chem has completed all turf fertilization, post weed applications, and pre-m in all turf/shrub areas within ph1. Our team manually water the turf zones after fertilization was applied. Please see attached reports.

Weekly Maintenance

Maintenance crew is focused on completing our weekly maintenance program within ph3. Our detail personal has been busy preforming weekly weed control within plant beds, removing fallen limbs from tree canopies, removing vine that exposes through plant materials.

Irrigation

Our irrigation team completed the monthly inspection, which included nozzle cleaning and head/nozzle adjustments as needed throughout the property. The ph3 irrigation system is now running 2x per week on turf and 1x per week on plant bed areas. Clocks have been adjusted to reflect daylight savings time change.

Agronomics

Fert/chem has completed all turf fertilization, post weed applications within ph3. Our team manually waters the turf zones after fertilization was applied. Please see attached reports.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TROUT CREEK COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT AND RUPPERT LANDSCAPE, LLC FOR LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT ("Amendment") is made and entered into as of this ____ day of October 2025, by and between:

TROUT CREEK COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT, a local unit of special-purpose government established pursuant to Chapter 190, *Florida Statutes*, being located in St. Johns County, Florida, whose mailing address is care of Rizzetta & Company, Inc., 3434 Colwell Avenue, Suite 200, Tampa, Florida 33614 (the "**District**"), and

RUPPERT LANDSCAPE, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company authorized to transact business in Florida, with an address of 23601 Laytonsville Road, Laytonsville, MD 20882 (the "Contractor" and, together with the District, the "Parties").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the District and The Tree Amigos Outdoor Services LLC ("Predecessor") previously entered into that certain *Trout Creek Community Development District Landscape & Irrigation Maintenance Services Agreement* dated February 1, 2024 (the "Agreement"), incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, after the Agreement was executed, Predecessor, Contractor, and District executed that certain Consent to Assignment of the Agreement for Landscape & Irrigation Maintenance Services by and between Trout Creek Community Development District and the Tree Amigos Outdoor Services, LLC, to Ruppert Landscape, LLC, dated October 31, 2024, wherein Contractor assumed all of Predecessor's rights, duties, and obligations under the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Parties now desire to amend the Agreement to reduce the service area included in the Maintenance Maps/Plans, defined in and attached as Exhibit C to the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 8(h) of the Agreement, the Agreement may be amended by an instrument in writing executed by the Parties; and

WHEREAS, the District and Contractor each represent that it has the authority to execute this Amendment and to perform its obligations and duties hereunder, and each has satisfied all conditions precedent to the execution of this Amendment so that this Amendment constitutes a legal and binding obligation of each party hereto.

NOW, **THEREFORE**, based upon good and valuable consideration and the mutual covenants of the Parties, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

SECTION 1. INCORPORATION OF RECITALS. The recitals stated above are true and correct and by this reference are incorporated herein and form a material part of this Amendment.

- **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT TO AGREEMENT.** Pursuant to Section 8(h) of the Agreement, the Parties agree to amend the Agreement in the following manner:
 - **A.** The Scope of Services set forth in Exhibit A to the Agreement is amended to no longer apply to the service area circled in red as depicted on the Service Area Map **Exhibit A** attached hereto.
 - **B.** The Maintenance Maps/Plans attached to the Agreement as Exhibit C are hereby amended to remove the service area circled in red as depicted on the Service Area Map attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.
- **SECTION 3. AFFIRMATION OF THE AGREEMENT.** The Agreement is hereby affirmed and continues to constitute a valid and binding agreement between the Parties. Except as described in Section 2 of this Amendment, nothing herein shall modify the rights and obligations of the Parties under the Agreement. All the remaining provisions, including, but not limited to, the engagement of services, fees, costs, indemnification, and sovereign immunity provisions, remain in full effect and fully enforceable.
- **SECTION 4. AUTHORIZATION.** The execution of this Amendment has been duly authorized by the appropriate body or official of the District and the Contractor, both the District and the Contractor have complied with all the requirements of law, and both the District and the Contractor have full power and authority to comply with the terms and provisions of this Amendment.
- **SECTION 5. EXECUTION IN COUNTERPARTS.** This Amendment may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which when executed and delivered shall be an original; however, all such counterparts together shall constitute but one and the same instrument.
- **SECTION 6. ANTI-HUMAN TRAFFICKING REQUIREMENTS.** Contractor represents and warrants that neither it nor its principals utilize coercion for labor or services as defined in Section 787.06, *Florida Statutes*. Contractor agrees to execute the affidavit, in a form acceptable to the District, in compliance with Section 787.06(13), *Florida Statutes*.
- **SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Amendment shall have an effective date as of the date first written above.

TROUT CREEK COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT, a local unit of special-purpose government established pursuant to Chapter 190, *Florida Statutes*, located in St. Johns County, Florida, whose mailing address is in care of Rizzetta & Company, Inc., 3434 Colwell Avenue, Suite 200, Tampa, Florida 33614 (the "**District**"); and

PRESTIGE LANDSCAPES OF NORTH FLORIDA, INC., a Florida corporation, with a mailing address of P.O. Box 600061, St Johns, FL 32260 (the "Contractor" and, together with the District, the "Parties").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the District and Contractor entered into that certain Landscape and Irrigation Maintenance Agreement between Trout Creek Community Development District and Prestige Landscapes of North Florida, Inc. dated May 15, 2021, as amended (the "Master Agreement," and together with this Addendum, the "Agreement"), incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, the Parties now desire to amend the Agreement to supplement the Scope of Services as defined in and attached as Exhibit A to the Master Agreement to include mowing and landscape maintenance services for the area depicted on the map attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 20 of the Master Agreement, the Agreement may be amended by an instrument in writing executed by the Parties; and

WHEREAS, the District and Contractor each represent that it has the authority to execute this Addendum and to perform its obligations and duties hereunder, and each has satisfied all conditions precedent to the execution of this Addendum so that this Addendum constitutes a legal and binding obligation of each party hereto.

NOW, **THEREFORE**, based upon good and valuable consideration and the mutual covenants of the Parties, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties agree as follows:

- **SECTION 1. INCORPORATION OF RECITALS.** The recitals stated above are true and correct and by this reference are incorporated herein and form a material part of this Addendum.
